MODALS	USAGE
could/may/might	<ul> <li>to say something is possible but not certain</li> </ul>
can't	<ul> <li>to say something is impossible</li> </ul>
must	<ul> <li>to show we know something is true (and there are reasons for this suggestion)</li> </ul>
should	<ul> <li>to suggest something is true (and there are reasons for this suggestion)</li> </ul>
have to	<ul> <li>when we talk about obligations (things we have no choice about doing)</li> </ul>
need to	<ul> <li>when we talk about things that are necessary to do in order to achieve a goal</li> </ul>
would rather	<ul> <li>to show preference for one thing over another thing</li> </ul>
had better	<ul> <li>to give advice about specific over another thing</li> </ul>
should and ought to	<ul> <li>should and ought to are similar but should is used more than ought to.</li> <li>We used should and ought to to talk about obligation and give advice.</li> </ul>
