



## Activity

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### Recite Poems

#### Task

1. Pupils are given sheets of the poem 'Clap Your Hands'.
2. Teacher to first read the poem aloud.
3. Pupils work in groups of four or five.
4. Each group to recite the poem with the correct stress, pronunciation, rhythm and intonation. Pupils also to do the actions related to the poem.
5. Pupils must then recite a poem about another action. They can use the poem 'Clap Your Hand' as a guide.

Very wide.


Clap hands fast

## Task

1. Pupils to work in groups.
2. Pupils must sit in a circle.
3. The teacher will pass a ball to a pupil in the group. The pupil will talk about their most favourite subject and least favourite subject.
4. The pupil then passes the ball to another group member. That group member too talks about their most favourite subject and least favourite subject.
5. The ball is passed around the group until all group members have spoken about their favourite subject and least favourite subject.



## Task

1. Pupils to work in groups.
2. Each group must create a brochure on a festival celebrated in Malaysia. For example: Hari Raya Aidilfitri.
3. Pupils to search for photographs or pictures online or in magazines. They must paste the photographs or pictures on coloured paper and decorate the brochure attractively. Pupils may include fun and interesting facts.
4. After completing the brochure, pupils to display their brochure on the class noticeboard or walls.
5. Then each group must write positive comments and suggestions on sticky notes and to paste it on the brochure.
6. The best three brochures will be selected to be displayed on the school art wall.

## Materials Needed:

- Pictures and photographs of Hari Raya Aidilfitri
- Marker, pens / highlighter pens
- Coloured pencils / crayons / pens
- Glue / cellophane tape
- Coloured art paper
- A pair of scissors
- Glitter, ribbons

## Sample:

## Task


1. Pupils to work in groups.
2. Pupils to list down the ways to live healthily.  
For example: eat fruits.
3. Pupils to make a poster on *How to Live Healthily*.
4. Pupils may use materials such as a large piece of paper, pencil, coloured pencil or water colours.
5. Make the poster as attractive as possible.

## Task

1. Pupils to work in pairs.
2. A picture card of a place is shown to pupils. For example: at a busy road.
3. Pupils must study the picture card carefully.
4. Pupils must then describe what they can see in the picture card.
5. Each pair of pupils then to discuss 'how to stay safe when on the road'.
6. Pupils to write down their answers on a piece of paper.
7. Each pair then presents their answers to the class.



Suggested answer:

How to stay safe on the road:


- Look left and right before crossing.
- Cross road using zebra crossing.
- Wait for the light to turn red before crossing road.
- Wear the seat belt when in a car.
- Cycle on the bicycle lane.
- Do not play on the road.

## Task

1. Pupils to work in pairs.
2. The notes and pictures below show an old item being reused, which is an empty oatmeal container being made into a drum.
3. Based on the notes and pictures, pupils to choose an old item that they can reuse.
4. Pupils then have to think about the things that they need for the activity and discuss how they are going to carry it out.
5. Finally, pupils have to share their ideas with the class.

Supplies needed:

An empty oatmeal container, a sheet of construction paper (any colour), glue, stickers.



First, use a measuring tape to measure from the bottom tip of the container to just below the rim.



Then, cut out the construction paper using the measurement of the container.



After that, take off the top of the container and put glue on the construction paper.



Next, roll the construction paper onto the container.



Finally, decorate the drum with stickers and put the top back on.
