At the beginning of the year, I set a challenge for myself: go solo camping. I've gone camping many times before but never alone.

My first thought was that I'd be able to enjoy my natural surroundings at my own pace. I could hike as fast or as slow as I'd like. Or even spend my time indulging in my favourite activities, photography being at the top of my list.

I knew I'd have to do some extra preparation since I'd be going on my own. After all I wouldn't have anyone with me to rely on. First, I decided to rediscover camping essentials. Solo camping, even for an experienced camper, can be challenging. So I revisited the basics such as pitching a tent, building a fire, navigating through the jungle, learning how to get clean supply of water, what to do if I encountered a wild animal and how to administer first aid to deal with minor injuries.

Next, I decided where I wanted to spend my camping trip. I picked a familiar spot, one that I've visited twice before as well as it wasn't very far from my house. Being in familiar surroundings will not only make me feel comfortable and give me the confidence but also help me relax so I can enjoy myself without worry.

I dedicated some time to researching the campsite too. I read up about it. Besides that, I checked out the jungle trails, ranger advisory, flora and fauna in the area and activities available. Fortunately, there were many guided activities so I settled on guided night and day walks, a bird-watching excursion and boating.

In addition, I **talked to several of my friends** who've been on solo camping trips

before. One common tip I got was to stay for more than a night. Their reasoning was simple: staying in the jungle is going to be uncomfortable and I'd probably need several days to get used to the solitude. In the end, I settled on three nights. That'd be just enough time to get comfortable and enjoy my surroundings.

Next, I opted to pack light. One of my friends suggested that I take a hammock and sleeping bag. But I decided against that. Instead, I took a lightweight, one-person tent and a sleeping pad. I didn't mind the extra load because I wanted protection from the heat and rain and I didn't want to be out in the open especially at night. Other than the usual camping gear, I also packed a good book. There will be a lot of alone time and reading also helps me to fall asleep.

Before I left, I informed my family about my plans. It's very important to share your plans with others so they know where you'll be and when you'll leaving and expected back.

There were many times before the trip that I was plagued by self-doubt; could I really do it? But being well-prepared helped by ease my fears. When I was camping, there were moments, at night, when I felt afraid. The unfamiliar sounds of nocturnal animals or rustling of the tree branches did keep me up sometimes. Thankfully, I had the book to divert my attention long enough until I fell asleep.

All in all, my solo camping trip was a success. I must say it was an extremely freeing experience. For four days and three nights, I depended on myself to survive in the jungle. Just as in life's journey, even when surrounded by family and friends, we can only depend on ourselves to navigate through life and its challenges.
